History

The Sheppard and Lapsley Presbyterian University, named so in recognition of the two first American Presbyterian Missionaries who evangelized the Congo in 1891, is the only graduate school for ministers and lawyers for the Presbyterian Churches in Central Africa.

The first organized effort to train Congolese for ministry was the Bible School created in 1897. In 1976 the accreditation level of the school was enhanced. Meanwhile the addition of a law school in 1998 led to the creation of the Presbyterian University Sheppard and Lapsley of Congo. The University offers two degree programs: A graduate program for 3 years and a licensing program for 5 years in each of the two disciplines: Theology and Law. The University Council of Congo accredits these programs.



The University is known as a strong institution, offering solid programs. Admission is competitive, and we receive far more applications from well-qualified students than we are able to admit because of lack of funds. The growth of the University's mission and the nation's need have not yet been matched by the necessary financial resources to fully develop this institution into one worthy of the name "Presbyterian."

The needs include:

- **A women's student dormitory**
- **Books and instructional equipment**
- **4 new classrooms and 80 desks**
- **Scholarships/financial aid**
- **Faculty pay. Professors are not always paid regularly, yet they continue teaching in hopes the situation will improve.**

At UPRECOCO \$250 sends one student through one year of seminary. \$1,250 supports the entire 5-year education of a minister who will lead the people of the Congo to the salvation, hope, and love of God.
